Aims:

To introduce students to the contemporary church worldwide with a particular focus on the majority world.

To provide students with some understanding of factors behind the current shape of the church in those areas

To give students the opportunity to engage positively with some aspects of majority world Christianity today.

To grow in appreciation for the work of God in a global context whilst identifying

appropriate application to one's own local setting.

Content:

An outline of the current scope and state of the church in several different regions (e.g. sub-Saharan Africa) or sub-regions (e.g. Southern India) worldwide. This may include focusing on one context in more detail.

An introduction to some factors which have shaped the church in those contexts, cultural, historical and theological.

An opportunity to reflect thoughtfully on personal experiences of non-Western Christianity and their relevance to one's own faith, ministry and mission in context.
