

## Exploring Biblical Theology (TMM2837)

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Module Level: 5

Module Credit Value: 10

Aims: To develop previous Bible content knowledge and deepen hermeneutical self-reflection;  
To facilitate an integrated understanding of the unity and diversity of the Bible.

Content: An introduction to selected major themes (e.g. God's covenants with his people), methods (e.g., typology, the threefold division of the law) and/or issues (e.g., the relationship between OT and NT) within biblical theology.  
An assessment of how biblical theology intersects with exegesis and the Christian doctrinal tradition.

Learning Outcomes: By the end of this module students will be able to

Engage in detail with selected biblical text(s) within the context of the whole canon, considering questions of unity and diversity in the Bible.
