Content: An introduction to selected major themes (e.g. God's covenants with his people), methods (e.g., typology, the threefold division of the law) and/or issues (e.g., the relationship between OT and NT) within biblical theology. An assessment of how biblical theology intersects with exegesis and the Christian doctrinal tradition.
